The children will develop their understanding of Advent as a joyful liturgical season and allows them to participate in a special liturgy. |  |
| <p>English</p>  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We will begin this half term by looking at The Flower and how the author uses language effectively to create a dark and gloomy atmosphere. The children will learn about the effective use of adjectives (dark, miserable, gloomy, scary) within the text, expanded noun phrases (the dark, gloomy room.) and interesting verbs (e.g. staggered, stumbled, and wandered). We will then go on to look at the story 'Who's afraid of the big bad book?' and the children will look at how the author has twisted traditional fairytale characters to make them applicable to the modern day. We will be looking again at the author's use of adjectives, some alternatives to 'said' e.g. answered, replied, screamed, and then we will go on to inferring what characters are thinking and feeling at various points within the text. Next we will go on to look at The true story of the three little pigs. The children will explore the use of an alternative perspective and see how different characters have different sides to the story. We will also look at the author's use of character, questions and features of a letter. | |
