

Curriculum Information - Year One and Two - Spring 2

Class text

This half term we will be focusing on two really exciting new texts. We will begin our term reading 'The Snail and the Whale' by Julia Donaldson. We will be using this text to develop our character writing. Next, we will be reading 'The Day the crayons Quit' by Oliver Jeffers. We will be using this text to write an informal letter. We will look at the conventions of informal letters and use this to write a letter from one of the crayons who quit!





RE



The first unit we will be looking at in RE this half term, is forgiveness. We will look at how forgiveness is a gift we receive and how it is a way that we can show love to others. We will also look carefully at the choices we make and when we need to say sorry for our actions.

The second unit for this half term is **Lent**. We will look carefully at how Lent is a time of change and growing to be more like Jesus by following his example. The children will also have the opportunity to take part in Lenten liturgies as we celebrate our growth towards becoming like Jesus.

Y1:

- Continuing with addition and subtraction within 20.

	 Y2: Continuing with multiplication and division. Length and height. Mass, capacity and temperature. 	
Science	 Can materials be changed? Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses. Find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. 	
History	 Why is Josiah Wedgwood so important in Stoke? Use words and phrases like before, after, past, present, then and now. Use words and phrases like old, new, a long time ago. Know about someone famous who was born or lived near our town. 	
Art	How can I make a bird? Key Concepts: That there is a relationship between drawing & making - we can transform 2d to 3d. That we can use observational drawing and experimental mark-making together to make art. That we can work from similar stimulus or starting point but end up with very different individual results. That the individual results can then be brought together to make a whole artwork.	

Computing In computing this half term we will be focusing on 'Creating Pictures'. **Key Learning** To learn the functions of the 2Paint a Picture tool. To learn about and recreate the Impressionist style of art (Monet, Degas, Renoir). To recreate Pointillist art and look at the work of pointillist artists such as To learn about the work of Piet Mondrian and recreate the style using the lines template. To learn about the work of William Morris and recreate the style using the patterns template. To explore surrealism and eCollage. French The children will be using their French phrases during the afternoon register. Hello! We will be learning lots of basic phrases for Bonjour! greetings. Y2 will have swimming on Monday PE afternoons. Please see the school website for details on swimming kits. Y1 will have PE with Mrs Sigley on a Monday PM. Y1 and Y2 will have dance with Mr Case on Thursday mornings. Y1: We will be singing songs that help us to explore Music changing pitch and discern the highest note of a melody. We will listen out for changes in pitch in a variety of music examples. We will work together to make music that illustrates a traditional nursery rhyme, by choosing appropriate pitch and tempo; and we will continue to develop our reading of basic rhythm notation. Y2: We will be singing songs that use ostinato patterns. In listening to a range of musical examples, we will identify contrasts of dynamics and timbres in pieces that contain ostinati.
