Get outside!

Wrap up warm and go exploring outside! What can you see outside in February? Using crayons or paint, create a picture of an outdoor scene that you've looked at.

Buy some cress seeds and plant them in a small pot with soil from the garden. Place this on your windowsill, keep the soil damp and watch it grow.

Create a Valentines wreath using coloured paper and ribbon.

Seedballs

Create your very own seedballs by following the below instructions.

Resources and method*:

- Flour
- Soil
- Wildflower seeds
- Water
- Mixing bowl or bucket

1. Mix ten parts water with one part soil then slowly add water and mix until sticky like dough
2. Roll into golf ball size
3. Roll balls in tray of wildflower seeds
4. Leave to dry for a day or two
5. Plant or scatter in your garden
